Over the past ten years, we have had the joy and privilege of watching Kids 4 Harmony grow and prosper. It's been very much a community effort, from José Antonio Abreu's insight about the power of music to elevate children's lives in Venezuela, to Mark Churchill's dedication to training a new generation of teaching artists through El Sistema USA, to the imagination of Carolyn Burns, the then CEO of Berkshire Children and Families, now known as 18 Degrees, who sought to create a program that would build on children's strengths and capabilities.



Add to that mix a board willing to take a leap, friends who contributed talent and treasure over the years, the continuing investment made by 18 Degrees, the brilliant and dedicated teaching artists who have brought musical excellence to the program, and the parents and family members who show up at every performance, and provide the time, space, and encouragement that enables their children to grow and thrive. It was an experiment that has proven more successful than we could have imagined.

We celebrate and delight in the children as they mature into musicians, scholars, and mentors to each other. The first generation of Kids 4 Harmony is now in college or college bound, several with musical careers in their future. Even before reaching college, students are accomplishing wonderful things through the opportunities this program provides. Bravo, community! Bravo, children! We could not be more proud!

About the Newbergers

Eli and Carolyn Newberger retired to the Berkshires after long careers at Boston Children's Hospital and Harvard Medical School. Both are nationally recognized experts on child abuse and family violence. Eli is a musician as well as a renowned pediatrician. Carolyn is an artist, writer, and musician following her career in clinical and research psychology and human development.





Their deep commitment to children and families began in 1967, when they traveled to Upper Volta, now Burkina Faso, for two years with the Peace Corps, where Eli was the Peace Corps doctor. Throughout their careers, both Carolyn and Eli have been passionate advocates of child welfare and family well-being, collaborating for 30 years together at Boston Children's Hospital.

Once a fixture in Boston's jazz scene, *Eli and the Hot Six* was their band honoring the New Orleans tradition, featuring Eli on tuba and Carolyn on washboard. Carolyn has also played flute and piccolo professionally. At his 75th birthday gig at Scullers Jazz Club in Cambridge in 2015, Eli told the crowd, "The amygdala in the brain is the center for our cessation of stress... This is also where music enters our brain." Both Eli and Carolyn have been passionate proponents of music's power to reduce stress, heal trauma, and transform lives.

Owen Young Guest Artist

We welcome Owen Young, distinguished cellist with the Boston Symphony Orchestra since 1991, and the John F. Cogan Jr., and Mary L. Cornille chair, endowed in perpetuity.



Cellist Owen Young joined the BSO in August 1991. A frequent collaborator in chamber music concerts and festivals, he has been featured as concerto soloist with numerous orchestras. Young has appeared in the Tanglewood, Aspen, Banff, Davos, Sunflower, Gateway, Brevard, and St. Barth's music festivals and is a founding member of the innovative chamber ensemble Innuendo. His performances have been broadcast on National Public Radio, WQED in Pittsburgh, WITF in Harrisburg, and WGBH in Boston. He has performed frequently with singer/songwriter James Taylor, including the nationally televised concert "James Taylor Live at the Beacon Theatre" in New York City.

Young was formerly on the faculties of Boston Conservatory, New England Conservatory School of Continuing Education, and Longy School of Music. He is currently on the faculty of Berklee College of Music and is active in Project STEP — String Training and Education Program for students of color. From 1991 to 1996 he was a Harvard-appointed resident tutor and director of concerts in Dunster House at Harvard University.

His teachers included Elinor Osborn, Michael Grebanier, Anne Martindale Williams, and Aldo Parisot. Young holds both bachelor's and master's degrees from Yale University. He was a Tanglewood Music Center Fellow in 1986 and 1987.

After winning an Orchestra Fellowship in 1987, he played with the Atlanta Symphony Orchestra in 1988 and with the Boston Symphony Orchestra in 1988–89. He was a member of the New Haven Symphony Orchestra in 1986–87 and of the Pittsburgh Symphony Orchestra from 1989 until he joined the BSO in 1991.
